

## *Klamath Registered Trees*

**Catalpa** - 1855 Lowell St. Est. 50 years, 20 inches diameter, 70 feet tall with a 40 foot crown spread. Deciduous. Giant, tropical-looking leaves and giant white flower panicles, 4" - 8" long in spring. Long seedpods hang down through winter. Clump is not usually seen in this species.

**Crimson King Norway Maple** - 2427 California Ave. Est. 50 years old, 24 inches diameter, 35 feet tall with 25 foot crown spread. Deciduous. Beautiful fall color changing from purple-red leaf to reddish-orange in fall. Possible the largest tree of its species in the Klamath Falls area.

**Norway Spruce (pair)** - 500 Klamath Ave. 25" - 27" diameter, 80-90 feet tall with 30 - 35 foot crown spread. Evergreen. Large specimens of a local favorite. Native to northern and central Europe.

## *Outstanding Tree Registry*

The Klamath Outstanding Tree Registry was founded in 2000 by the Klamath Tree League (formerly Klamath Community Forestry Council). The League wants to identify and recognize significant trees in the Klamath Falls community in order to record and protect their special importance for future generations. Nominations are accepted and trees are judged each year. This brochure has been produced for use during walking or driving tours to view these outstanding trees. ## *Klamath Registered Trees*

**Paper Birch Clump**—4880 Gatewood. Six stems grow from one root. Trunk circumferences range from 2 feet 1 1/2 inches to 3 feet 1 1/2 inches. Pure white bark, dark green leaves, vigorous.

**Eastern Cottonwood**—4th and Oak Street in parking planter on northeast corner. Very large and healthy. 100 feet tall, 20 foot circumference, 72 inches in diameter with a 75 foot crown spread.

**Black Walnut**—2403 Wantland. 70 feet tall with 70 foot crown spread. 29 1/2 inches in diameter. Nice specimen of an uncommon species in our area.

**Sycamore Maple**—711 Pacific Terrace. Estimated to be 75 to 80 years old. Circumference 9 feet 9 inches. Height 68 feet. Diameter 37.5 inches. Crown spread 48 feet.

- \* Proper pruning and maintenance, good form

## *Klamath Registered Trees*

**Japanese Green Maple** - 1208 Pacific Terrace - Est. 50 years old, 20' tall x 18' crown width. One of the largest in the area with outstanding fall color.

**Silver Maple** - 128 Riverside Drive - Est. 100 years old, 70' tall. Planted at the historic Moore homesite, which has been known as "The Maples" for many years.

**Pin Oak** - Conger Park at Siskiyou and Addison - 51' tall x 44' crown width. Very large for this species, handsome shape, outstanding fall color, good location.

**Japanese Red-leaf Maple** - 230 N. 10th - Est. 50+ years old, 25' tall x 32' crown width. One of the largest, oldest of the species in the area. Outstanding shape and fall color.

**Norway Maple** - 850 Pacific Terrace - 60' tall x 50' crown width. Outstanding fall color, well-shaped, very mature.

**Pin Oak** - Boy Scout Headquarters at Kit Carson Park - Est. 70 years. This tree was moved approx. 1960 from the Klamath Falls Post Office when the building was expanded.

**London Planetrees** - Veteran's Park - A spectacular group of seven trees valued for their shade and beautiful crowns. Flaking bark creates interesting trunk patterns. The crowns range from 55' to 75' crown width with trunk diameters up to 4'. Planted approx. 1950. An uncommon species in our area.

## *Klamath Registered Trees*

**Ponderosa Pine** - Moore Park - This pine is approx. 150' tall and 55' crown width. It is a magnificent example of our stately native. Located along driveway into the City Park shop buildings.

**Silver Maple** - Moore Park - Possibly the largest silver maple in Oregon. Approx. 100' tall and 90' crown width. Located 120' northeast of picnic area.

**Silver Maple** - Moore Park - This tree is highly appreciated by park visitors for its wonderful wide crown. Approx. 60' tall and 96' crown width. 75' north of picnic area.

**Sycamore Maple** - 430 Riverside - Unusual maple species. Very handsome oval crown with excellent branch structure. Fast grower that tolerates poor soil and high salt.

**Red Oak** - Veteran's Park - A beautiful grouping of 3 red oaks near the stage area. Crowns average 45' wide. Handsome red fall color.

**European White Birch** - 4856 Clinton (Peterson Elementary School) - An extremely handsome clump of 4 birch with very white bark and graceful weeping branches. Excellent shape and health.

**Pin Oak** - 430 Riverside - One of the largest in Klamath Falls with extremely wide trunk. Approx. 60' tall and 40' crown width. Pin oaks are large trees with a magnificent shape and spectacular red-orange-gold fall color. Slow growing.

**Catalpa** - 821 Mt. Whitney - Very large and nicely shaped catalpa tree. Approx. 70' tall, 35' crown width. Giant, tropical-looking leaves and giant white flower panicles, 4"-8" long in spring. Seed pods hang down through winter.

**Schwedler Norway Maple** - 4512 Clinton - Majestic pair of round-headed maples with dark red foliage in spring that turns to dark green in summer. Excellent branching structure. Planted approx. 1950.

**Spanish Pin Fir** - 119 Washington - Unusual species, possibly one of only 2 or 3 in our area. This handsome specimen has a broadly pyramidal shape and displays the species' unusual fat, blunt needles.

**Horse Chestnut** - 1907 Melrose - 35 inches diameter and 50 feet tall. Deciduous. A beautiful, fruitless variety, especially noticeable in the spring when it is in blossom. Provides dense shade.

**Lombardy Poplar** - 234 North 4th. Est. 80+ years old, 60 inches diameter, 122 feet tall with a 45 foot crown spread. Deciduous. Dense green foliage on this fast-growing species with narrow, erect crown. This one is tall for the species.

**Incense Cedar** - 500 Jefferson St. 29 inches diameter, 66 feet tall with 30 foot crown spread. Evergreen. Large, coniferous street tree with narrow crown. Aromatic needles. Locally native.
